**Objectives**

The objectives of this meeting are threefold: 1) introduce successful mercury mine systems, and previous mining operation remediation, 2) successful soil-grape relationships and sustainable vineyard management, and 3) soil-olive relationships and management practices.

**General Logistics**

The 2008 annual meeting of PSSAC will begin Thursday evening with a PSSAC Board Meeting from 4:30—6:30 p.m. An agenda will be distributed to the board members prior to the meeting.

The field tour will depart from the parking lot of the Paso Robles Courtyard by Marriott at 8:00 a.m. and return at approximately 5:00 p.m. on both Friday and Saturday, March 28 and 29, 2008.

PSSAC's Annual Meeting and Dinner Banquet will begin at 6:30 p.m. on Friday, March 28th at the Courtyard by Marriott.

A registration desk for the 2008 Annual Meeting of PSSAC will be available in the lobby of the Paso Robles Courtyard Marriot from 6:30—8:00 p.m. Late-arriving participants who have pre-registered may pick up their name badges and other materials at the bus between 7:30—8:00 a.m. on Friday, March 28th.



## **FIELD TOUR INFORMATION**

Friday, March 28. The field tour will leave the parking lot of the Paso Robles Courtyard by Marriott at 8:00 a.m. and will travel to the Buena Vista and Klau mercury mine sites. Tour participants will hike to view road cuts, mine reclamation sites and associated soils and geology. An EPA and/or California Regional Water Quality Board representative will discuss the recent reclamation efforts at this site.

The lunch stop will take place at Carmody McKnight Estate Wines and Vineyard. Discuss vineyard and regional earth science conditions.

In the afternoon field tour participants will hike throughout the vineyard to view three soil pits (Entisols, Mollisols and Vertisols) and related vineyard practices. Continuing discussions at each pit of soil and wine quality relationships will be conducted based on the results of a three-year research study. Greg Cropper (winemaker and vineyard manager) and Gary Conway (proprietor) will be guest speakers.

Return to the Paso Robles Courtyard by Marriott at approximately 5:00 p.m.

Saturday, March 29. The field tour will leave the parking lot of the Paso Robles Courtyard Marriott at 8:00 a.m. and will travel to the Pasolivo Olive Ranch. Tour participants will hike and view the olive groves with its 12 varieties and discuss the associated soils and geology. The olive ranch owner will discuss his agricultural practices (irrigation, fertilization, etc.). A tour of the olive oil processing facility and olive oil tasting will be available.

The lunch stop will be held at Halter Ranch Vineyard and Winery. A discussion of sustainable vineyard practices will be conducted by Mitch Wyss (vineyard manager).

In the afternoon field tour participants will hike throughout the vineyard to view four soil pits (Entisols, Inceptisols, Mollisols and Vertisols), the associated geology (calcareous Monterey Formation, Sandholdt member) and related vineyard practices. At each pit discussions of soil formation and sustainable vineyard practices will continue. Mitch Wyss (vineyard manager) will be the guest speaker. Wine tastings will be available for those interested.

Return to the Paso Robles Courtyard by Marriott at approximately 5:00 p.m.

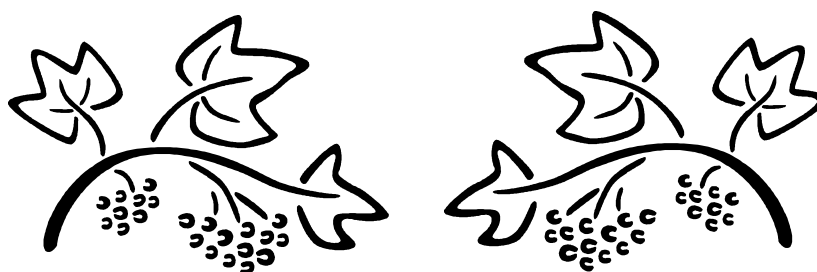


function. This smoke-free facility offers free Wi-Fi and a reasonably-priced breakfast buffet is available each morning. A heated pool and spa are available.
