The 2014 Annual Field Tour will be featuring soils of the Feather River ultramafic body and honoring the work of longtime CFSC member, Earl Alexander. According to Earl, this is one of the most interesting serpentine areas in California. The Feather River body stretches from the type locality of the Forbes soil in the Forest Hill area on the Tahoe National Forest to the Red Hill area north of the Feather River on the Plumas National Forest. Events include field trips and discussions on serpentine soil morphology and ecology, meadow restoration, and post-fire forest management. Evening programs include a catered dinner, BBQ, drinks, presentations, and social hours, all set in the scenic backdrop of the Northern Sierras.

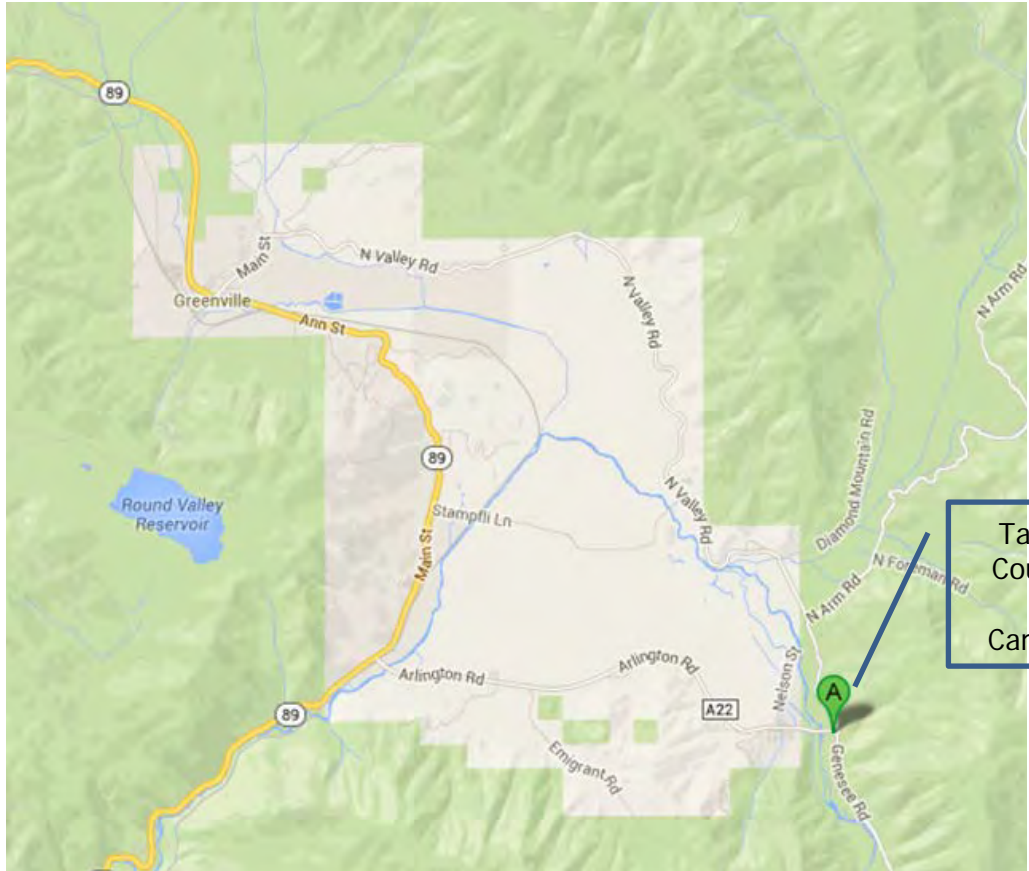

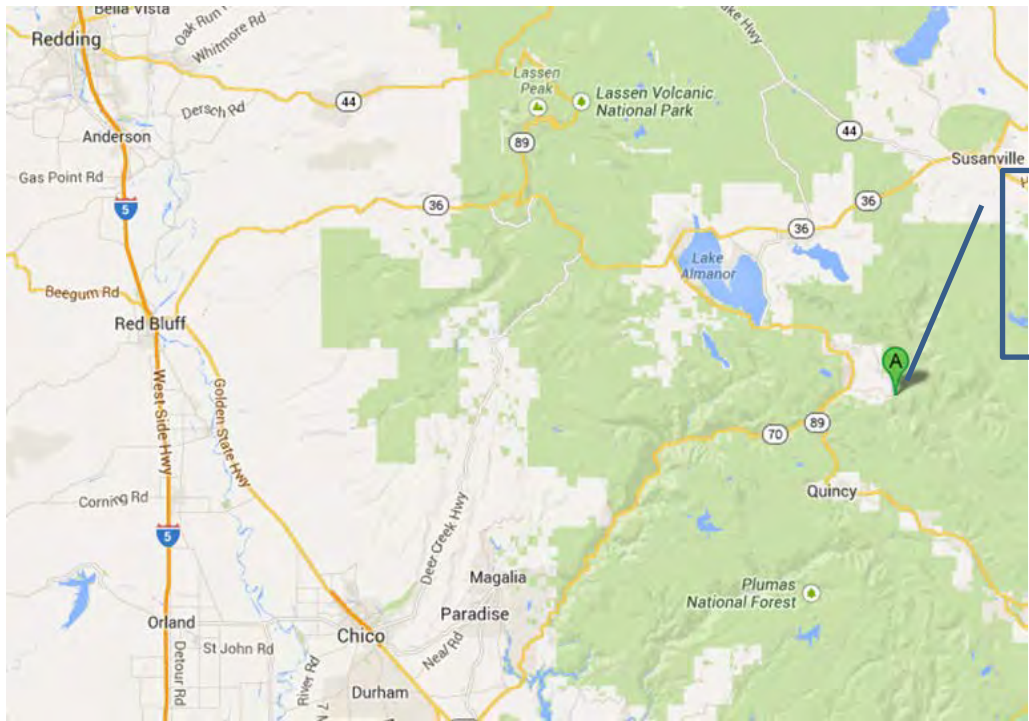
Camping and services
